FIRST TRAINING SESSION 6 - 10 MARCH 2024

UNDERSTANDING THE CONTEXT

This session, led by Imean Academy, Activa International Foundation and Okyanus Atasehir Yasli Bakim, focuses on introducing participants to the landscape policy around culture-sensitive care. both nationally and internationally. This foundational training will provide a broad perspective on the various aspects of culturesensitive care, setting the stage for more detailed learning and application subsequent in sessions.



ERASMUS+ PROJECT KA-210 ADU CARE FOR CARE

The Erasmus+ KA-210 ADU project is focused on enhancing cultural sensitivity in healthcare, with a particular emphasis on facilitating the integration of healthcare workers from Turkey in the Netherlands and improving the care for Dutch patients seeking treatment in Turkey.



PROBLEM

A key issue is the upcoming shortage of healthcare workers and especially those able to work with the growing number people with a migration background in the Netherlands.

Concurrently, there's a growing trend of Dutch patients seeking medical treatment in Turkey. However, Turkish healthcare workers' lack of experience in treating foreign patients, including Dutch, poses a barrier to providing quality care.

OBJECTIVE

The project's primary goal is to develop a blueprint for an pathway educational healthcare professionals. This pathway aims to bridge cultural gaps and enhance the skills of healthcare workers, ensuring they can provide culturally sensitive care to patients from diverse backgrounds.

RESULTS

anticipated The outcomes include a report on culturesensitive care aspects, a group of 10 health and care workers will complete who the <u>experimental</u> pathway and acquire new insights, qualifications, and skills, and blueprint the for an educational pathway for healthcare workers catering to clients from different member states.





ACTIVITIES

The project includes training sessions conducted by Imean Academy and Okyanus Atasehir Yasli Bakim for health and care workers from both the Netherlands and Turkey. These workshops will compare and contrast practices in each country, with observations informing the development of the educational pathway blueprint. This pathway is intended to be independent of the training sessions themselves
